1 Quiz and Questions

To open a Student-Quiz go to your course. The Student-Quiz activity are always represented with Figure 1: Student-Quiz Icon.

1.1 Main view

If Student-Quiz is set to anonymous the names of the question creator are not displayed.

1.1.1 Actions

You have several actions that he can perform on this screen.

- Create a new question with “**Create new question**” button
- Filter questions with the filter form
- Further select questions by check marking them
- Practice questions on filtered questions with “**Run filtered questions**” button
- Practice questions on checked questions with “**Run selected questions**” button
- Sort questions the different column headers
- Edit / delete own questions formerly created by you

1.1.2 Table

The table of this view has six columns with different information.

- **T**, represent the check column. You can select questions to practice them
- **Question**, shows the question name
- **Created by**, shows the question creator, this field may be anonym
- **Tags**, shows tags assigned to a question
- **Ratings**, shows ratings of a questions (1=bad, 5=good)
 - 1 star = very poor
 - 2 stars = poor
 - 3 stars = ok
 - 4 stars = good
 - 5 stars = very good
- **Difficulty**, shows the difficulty of the particular questions, based on answers (from 0=very simple to 1=very difficult)

1.2 Questions

To create a question use the “**Create first question**” or “**Create new question**” button.

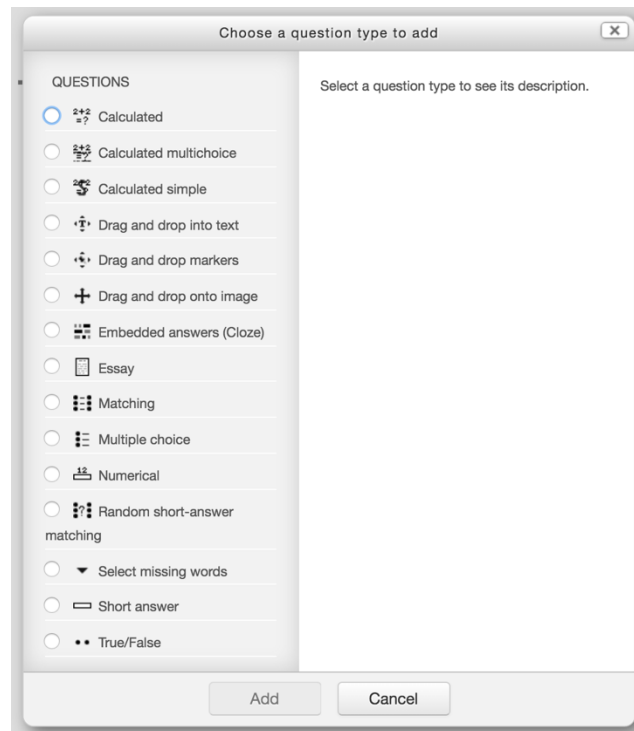


Figure 4: Question Types

1.3 Quiz

To practice questions press **“Run filtered questions”**. You can filter questions to practice a subset of the questions or select some questions in the table and press **“Run selected questions”**. On the the following screen press **“Attempt quiz now”** to start the quiz.

1.3.1 Quiz view

The Quiz has a navigation that allows to jump to specific questions and finish the quiz with **“Finish attempt ...”**

In the blue box is the question. You have several options:

- You can jump to any question with the navigation or press **“next”** to jump to the next question.
- You can answer the question without checking for the right answer and rating it. The question will be marked gray in the navigation.
- You can answer the question and check for the right answer. The question is marked green right answer or red wrong answer in the navigation. If the admin installed the addition Student-Quiz Question-Behavior plugin, you must rate the question and can add a comment or read the discussion.

The report section can found in the navigation of the Student-Quiz.

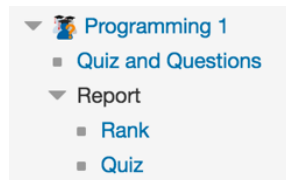


Figure 7: Student-Quiz Navigation
